2012 STATE TITLES

NEW BOATING AND FISHING RULES

There are two new rules that have come into being in Qld since January 1 and one introduced late last year, so I am just trying to bring you all up to speed on these, so that we are doing the right thing and it might save you some money.

Wearing Life Jackets – The mouth of the Mooloolah River has now been included in the locations that you will be required to wear a life jacket. This now means in all access points to the sea you must wear a life jacket – Caloundra Bar, Mooloolah River Bar and Noosa Bar.

Stowage of Life Jackets – If life jackets and safety equipment are not clearly visible to the passenger, the boat owner or master must give each person on board information on where the safety equipment is kept and clearly mark where they are stowed – **Penalty for lack of signs is \$200.00.**

Fin clipping of Coral Reef Fin Fish – In the past, all coral reef fin fish caught by recreational anglers had to have their pectoral fin removed. Fisheries decided late last year that it was not having the desired effect and therefore is no longer necessary.

<u>EARLY REGISTRATION FORMS</u> – At this stage, I have 30 early registration forms. Remember, I am not looking for money. All I want to know is that you are thinking of attending the 33rd National Championships, so we can keep you informed of what is happening.
